Important reminder – caddy liners and black sacks

The annual delivery of free food caddy liners has started to all 34,000 homes in the Derbyshire Dales. This is being undertaken by a dedicated team – not bin collection crews – and the deliveries will take around three weeks to complete.

Elton and Gratton residents should have already received their annual supply of food caddy liners and, for those on the sack scheme, the annual supply of black and compostable sacks.

If you have not received them, please contact the District Council straightaway on 01629 761100. Anybody who has not received their liners and sacks must report it by 31 July – otherwise charges will apply after this date.

The Wirksworth Team has two new recruits.

Well not quite! For the last few years the team has been well served by Rod Prince and John Spreadborough, who have acted as Readers. This means that they have had a licence from the Bishop to preach and assist with services and the pastoral work around the parishes that we serve.

John is well known to people in Elton as he lives in the village. Both have them have come from different directions to the conclusion that they wish to offer themselves for ordination as priests within the Church of England, and having gone through a rigorous selection procedure, both have been accepted to begin training.

Neither John nor Rod will be leaving the Wirksworth Team once their training is over. They will continue to act in a similar capacity as before, though they will both be able to do more in that they will be able to preside at the Communion Service, baptise and marry. Their contribution, therefore, will be greater than before, and at a time when the number of full time clergy across the whole of the Church continues to fall, their services will remain invaluable to us.

As before, both Rod and John will be taking services around the team churches, though John will be more focused on Elton, whereas Rod will focus on Brassington which is where he currently lives.

It's a little while before their training will be complete, so no changes for the present, but we wish them well as they begin on this stage of their Christian journey.

The scheme allows me to grant small sums of money to community groups, clubs and organisations in my council ward. This year I have £900 which applicants can use to fund one-off projects or purchases, such as trips out, buying equipment or funding an event.

The minimum grant that can be awarded is £100 and the maximum is £1000 but I am aiming to distribute funding as evenly as possible across the three parishes I represent – Elton, Winster and South Darley. I am also looking to grant money to groups that have not already done so.

County Council elections results

Elections were held on Thursday 4 May 2017 to elect a County Councillor for the Dovedale Division – which includes the parishes of Elton and Gratton.

The results were declared on Friday 5 May 2017 and were as follows:

Martin Aiton (Liberal Democrats) 241
Tom Barker (Labour) 433
Simon Spencer (Conservative) 1825 – ELECTED
Colin Swindell (Independent) 1250
John Robin Youatt (Green Party) 132

Simon Spencer holds the seat for the Conservatives. The turnout was 42.3%.

The overall result saw the Conservatives winning 37 seats, Labour 24, and Liberal Democrats 3. The Conservatives have a majority of 10 councillors and take back control of Derbyshire County Council from Labour who have been in control for the past 4 years.

SAD GOODBYES

Sadly, the month of February saw the loss of two notable former residents of the village.

Aly Piggott, who was 77, originated from Youlgrave but moved here following his marriage to Elton girl Jennifer Walker. Their first home was on West End in a house which they romantically re-named 'Jenaly'. Later on – they moved to larger premises at the opposite end of the village where they raised their two sons Anthony and Richard, both of whom are always particularly welcome visitors when they come back to Elton.

At his funeral in Elton Church, Aly was very accurately described as community-focussed. There are too many village activities with which he was associated to list in this short piece but they ranged from running the youth club for a time at one end of the age spectrum, to being a member of the village fire brigade at the more mature end of things. But it is perhaps his development and organisation of the very successful 'It's a Knock-out' events for which he will be best remembered. This was at the time the village was striving to raise the funds required to purchase the playing field.

I was a member of Aly's Elton team but it is only now that I come to appreciate just how many arms he must have twisted, and how many favours he must have called in to persuade so many villages and organisations to turn up with teams and their supporters. This, combined with Aly's consistently good fortune with the weather, ensured that the events were always very well attended and were significant fundraisers. No-one who was there could ever forget the time when the water tank used in some of the events burst its sides with a mighty crash and caused a short-term flash flood!

Born in 1921, Joan Andrews hailed originally from Chilwell near Nottingham . As a young woman during the Second World War Joan did her bit as a 'Land Girl' in Leicestershire. For those who don't know – Land Girls were members of the 'British Women's Land Army' an organisation created to solve the problem of the shortage of agriculture workers with so many men in the forces. On a visit here to see her cousins in Moor Lane Joan caught the eye of Elton soldier Tom Andrews who was home on leave. The rest is history. Tom and Joan were married in 1943 with the war still underway. After an early stint in Ivy Lane, they spent most of their married life at Roseneath in Main Street where they raised two sons. Michael is a professional motor cyclist whose career I have described at some length in a previous article for the Echo. Mick's younger brother, Barry, is a (now retired) head teacher.

As a consequence of their wartime experiences Tom and Joan both took their Remembrance responsibilities very seriously. Along with Tom's sister Rene, Joan sold poppies door-to-door in Elton for more years than anyone can remember. Joan and Rene each received a special award from the Royal British Legion when they reached twenty-five years of poppy selling but they carried on for a good few years after that.

Joan had reached the age of 95 when she died. Sadly, she suffered from Alzheimers towards the end of her life and, as a consequence, spent her final years in residential care in Matlock Bath.

Whose turn is it for a bath this week?

This photo was taken in Well Street probably towards the end of the 19th century. A notice was put on the pump at the bottom of the street in 1923 warning that the water was contaminated and should be used only for washing and other domestic purposes, not for drinking. In 1932, in an attempt to prevent dirty surface water draining into the well, the Parish Council recommended that the stone pavers covering it should be cemented and a wall should be built around the pump above it. That was when 5-year-old Harry Garner was living nearby in what is now Laburnum Cottage. As soon as he was old enough, his mother sent him every day after school down to the troughs at Burycliff to collect the family's drinking water. Harry once said to me, "When we got mains water to the village about 1940 I thought I was in heaven. I only had to carry my heavy bucket from the stand tap at the top of the street". All the village stand taps were in use as late as 1956 because many properties were still not connected to the mains.

On the left of the photo is the chimney of 'The Square' on West End. In the early 20th century the single-storey building in front was William Stone's grocery shop. The small light patch, just below the left arm of the lady's yoke is where a flight of steps came down from the rector's garden allowing a short cut to the church. Next time you walk past, look at the wall behind the telegraph pole; you can still see the bottom step. The building on the right of the photo was demolished about 1925. This was the end of a row of three cottages that stood where last summer there was a magnificent display of Dahlias. Recent activity there suggests we'll be in for a similar treat this summer!

Village News and Views

Bakewell Choral Society and Buxton Musical Society to perform Verdi's *Requiem*

Two renowned Derbyshire choirs, Bakewell Choral Society and Buxton Musical Society, will join forces to sing Verdi's *Requiem* at St John's Church, Buxton on Sunday, 18 June 2017, at 7:30pm.

Founded in 1944, the Buxton Musical Society draws on the rich cultural life of the area to form a group of singers and players who regularly perform orchestral and choral works. Under the direction of Michael Williams MBE the Society performs five or six concerts a year at St John's Church and at the Buxton Opera House.

Bakewell Choral Society is a mixed choir of around 80 members, which was founded by Richard Barnes MBE in 1978. Richard died of cancer in 2012 and Alan Eost became Musical Director and Conductor in 2013. The choir performs four public concerts each year in and around Bakewell. Concerts are a blend of sacred and secular choral music, covering a wide repertoire from classical to contemporary works.

It will be the first collaboration between the two groups, and fourteen years since Bakewell Choral Society sang in Buxton.

The *Requiem* has been described as a milestone of the choral repertoire. Verdi used all his considerable skills gained in composing 25 operas to produce this deeply felt tribute to the Italian poet and novelist Alessandro Manzoni. Sometimes criticised as being too operatic in style for the religious subject matter ("an opera in ecclesiastical robes") no-one can complain about the conviction of the composer in creating this masterpiece.


